### Let your community know

- Start posting brightly colored flyers and posters in the area your pet went missing. Take flyers to local vets and shelters.
- Place brightly colored posters in your yard. Someone who found your pet may be driving around the area looking for their home



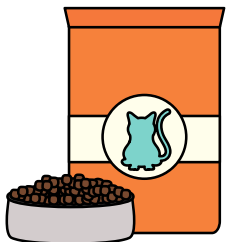
### Spread the word through social media

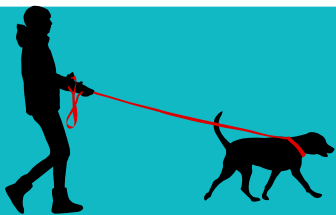
### Visit your local shelters

- Not only should you contact your local animal shelters to report your pet missing, but make a visit. Some shelters may not have the same resources as others, and often deal with a large population of animals.



### Set up traps and feeding stations

- Humane traps (referred to as Havahart) can be rented through ABC Rental Company, or purchased at feed supply stores. Set up several traps in the area your pet went missing with warm tuna or chicken
- Use familiar scents like a cut up piece of your pet's blanket to place along the way of the feeding stations leading to your home
